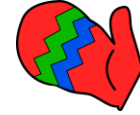




# Old Mill Preschool News

## Tips and Ideas: Helping your child write their name and other letters.

We have been really working on helping the students know how to hold a pencil and write their name and other letters. We encourage you to practice with them at home. Here are a new suggestions on how to help them write:

1. Rainbow writing- Students trace their name over and over with different colors.
2. Have students put together a name puzzle to help them to remember how to spell their name.
3. Write names in chalk on chalkboard and have students use a qtip to write over it.
4. Put paint in bag or shaving cream on table and then students write name in it.
5. Making letters out of play- doh.
